WHEREAS, motorcycles are increasingly being used as a regular means of transportation due to the current need to conserve fuel and our state's favorable climate for this mode of transportation; and

WHEREAS, the motorcycle is an energy-efficient vehicle that reduces fuel consumption, traffic, and parking congestion; and

WHEREAS, the motorcycle has proved to be an important form of transportation for commuting, as well as touring and recreation, both on and off the roads; and

WHEREAS, as a matter of safety, it is necessary to develop skills and an awareness of proper driving habits to handle these vehicles on the highways of our state;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jeb Bush, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor of the state of Florida, do hereby proclaim May 1999 as
